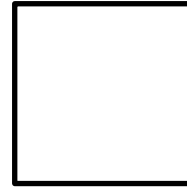
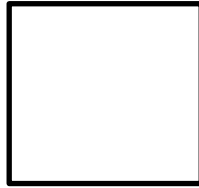
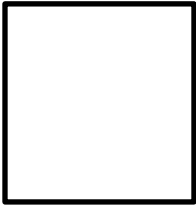


Colour

Primary colours

Primary colours cannot be mixed using other colours. What are they? Colour in the squares.



Answers: Primary colours: red, yellow and blue.

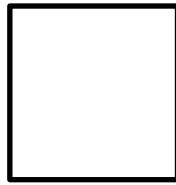
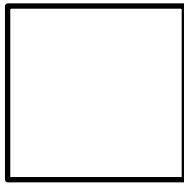
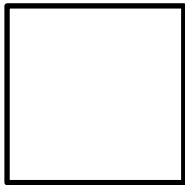
Secondary colours

Secondary colours are made by mixing two primary colours. (You can use paints or fibre tipped pens, food colouring or coloured playdough).

Blue and Red

Red and Yellow

Blue and Yellow



Secondary colours: blue and red make purple. Red and yellow make orange, Blue and yellow make green.

Tertiary colours

Tertiary colours are made by mixing the three primary colours together. (paints work best for this exercise).

Depending on the amount of each colour, you will get different results. Tertiary colours are a variety of browns or greys.
